#### Principal's Report

#### February 2020

Plans are well underway for the 2020-2021 school year. We are projected at 305 students; currently at 303. We held a feeder school information night on February 4<sup>th</sup> which had a great turn out. The highlight of the evening was definitely the student-led tours! Thank you to Nora and Tanya for coming out and representing School Council. Parents and students left feeling informed and less anxious about the transition to ECMS. Our feeder school day is scheduled for Thursday June 4<sup>th</sup>. For our planning, if you know of someone who is moving into the area, please encourage them to register with us as soon as possible as staffing is based on student enrolment.

Our feeder high schools paid a visit on Wednesday January 29, 2020. Course selection was discussed and high school students shared their experiences and provided words of advice. Course selection is due today (Tuesday February 18<sup>th</sup>). Messaging was sent out through School Messenger to all parents/guardians of Gr. 8 students about this date. It has also been posted on Google Classroom.

Term 1 grades have been submitted. As you know, teachers did not complete Term 1 report cards due to the labour action. In a communication you would have received from the Director of Education, Camille Williams-Taylor last week, Principals will not be able to provide marks to families at this time. Parents/guardians can contact their child's teacher to learn about their progress.

Wednesday February 26<sup>th</sup> is Pink Shirt Day. This day is designed to promote awareness about bullying and the terrible impact it has on students and their families. This year's theme is *Lift Each Other Up*. It is a simple but powerful message encouraging us to look beyond our differences and celebrate the things that make us unique. When we lift each other up, we see past the things that separate us and see instead the things that unite us as people. Teachers will be talking with their students, as appropriate, about this important day and message. You will also see many staff wearing pink T-shirts in support of this important day.

The installation of our Safe Welcome system is complete. Messaging will be going out to all families in the very near future about our new entry system. We will go live on Monday March 23, 2020. Reminder emails will be sent out prior to the launch.

Our Maker-Space area is nearly complete from a facilities point of view. Our Chief is working on making the cupboards look nicer and will be installing green screens in the very near future. The next step is to stock the room with resources (glue guns, pieces of wood and cardboard, small hand tools, technology, STEM resources, etc.). If you have any of these items on hand, please feel free to donate!

Although formal professional development around our School Improvement Plan is not occurring due to the job action, programming and instruction in the identified areas is occurring. Discussions about the use of diagnostics to identify gaps and targeted guided instruction to close them continue to occur. Specific resources were purchased to support instruction and learning at the Gr. 6 level and this cohort of teachers are still able to tap into the Math Instructional Coach for ideas and guidance.

While field trips, extra-curricular activities and assemblies may be struck work, there is still an exciting variety of learning activities taking place in the "halls" of ECMS. From scavenger hunts involving patterning questions to creative presentations about "Lennigen VS The Ants" to snow shoeing around our vast school yard and community, it is a delight to watch all the learning taking place.

A sincere thank you is extended to Tara Conroy for her incredible donation of microscopes to our Science teachers. They are a deeply valued gift and are greatly appreciated.
