Principal's Report - May 2023

I hope everyone had a wonderful Mother's Day weekend!

It's been an exciting 4 weeks since we last met. On Wednesday April 19th, I attended professional development on confronting and preventing hate in schools. The PD was offered through the Canadian Anti-Hate Network. Tomorrow, I attend additional learning about this important topic with the focus being the district's protocol for school administrators.

Just Jamaal has been providing poetry workshops for all classes and the students are loving it. Jamaa. He is a local poet who explores the thematic use of language as a portal to public speaking. He supports literacy by exploring language devices such as pattern, rhyme, figurative speech and syllabic metre and explores traditional and contemporary functions of melodic language. Every class will have a workshop with Jammal.

Plans are well on their way for our 50th Anniversary celebration next week on May 25th. We do hope you can join us. We are also planning a fun feeder school day on Friday June 9th. Our incoming Gr. 6 students will participate in engaging activities alongside our current Gr. 6 students.

We have received our tentative school organization for 2023-2024. At this time, our org. Is:

- 2 Gr. 6 Regular classes
- 2 Gr. 7 Regular classes
- 2 Gr. 8 Regular classes
- 2 Gr. 6 EFI classes
- 3 Gr. 7 EFI classes
- 2 Gr. 8 EFI classes
- English Language Development (ELD) class!

The ELD class is composed of 12 students in Gr. 6, 7 and 8 who have recently settled in Ottawa and whose learning was impacted in their previous country. The students receive Math, Language and Social Studies (History/Geography) in a congregated setting with an ESL teacher. The remainder of the students day is integrated into a larger class for the remainder of their subjects.

This makes for an increase of 2 classes which we are very excited about.

In-coming Principal Marc Slesar and I are working together to fill our teaching vacancies. I will share the staff assignments in June once we have hired. Christine Deschambault is retiring in June and Grant Lines is taking a leave next year so there will be lots of new faces around the halls of ECMS next year.

Teacher Update: May 17

EF6A EF6B	 Students are working on a French independent novel study where they are studying a character's development throughout the story. We have begun a Social Studies project about an environmental issue. Students will learn about how governments respond to the issue, and will develop an action plan outlining steps the government should start, stop and continue in order to help resolve the issue. In Science, we are working on a biodiversity project about how an individual species affects its surrounding ecosystem. Students will build a game in Scratch to show their species' impact on its ecosystem. Next Tuesday we will have our Scientists in Schools workshop on electricity. We had a visit from Just Jamaal who gave a poetry workshop. Students enjoyed hearing Jamaal's story of how he started writing poems when he was 9 years old, and the power of words. They participated in two writing activities and surprised themselves by being more poetic than they thought they could be!
EF67A	 Students are working hard on their French Communities projects. They have engaged with the editing process for their journals and are working towards building their scrapbooks from their imaginary trips. Students are starting Electricity (gr 6) and Pure Substances and Mixtures (gr 7) in Science.
EF7A	 Students are starting their debates about which French song has the best lyrics and message in French. They are also continuing their project about choreographers in Dance. Students are starting Heat in Science and discussing the war of 1812 in History
EF8A/B	 In geography, students are researching a global issue of their choice. Many students are exploring issues that feel personally relevant to them and develop their sense of connectedness to global communities. For example, some students are learning about police brutality and gun laws in the United States. Some are learning about violence against women, such as the inquiry into missing and murdered Indigenous women and children. In language, students are researching powerful words and quotes and preparing a presentation to persuade their audience that the words they choose are powerful. They are practicing using persuasive speaking techniques such as eye contact, inflection, gestures and pausing.
R8A/R8B	 In Geography students are creating islands. Everything from the topographical to the political side of the island. They must use knowledge obtained from lessons to build an island that can function and interact with the rest of the world (government, imports, exports etc,).
Clubs	BYE Club: BYE club is working away on their script about Viola Desmond's life. Their goal is to perform this play at the Talent Show at the end of the

- school year. Students have organized themselves into groups to write, find music, create sets and act in the play.
- Rainbow Alliance: Rainbow Alliance is looking forward to hosting an Allyship 101 presentation on June 1st as a kick off to Pride Month. This will include some information on the acronyms and flags, as well as how to be supportive of the 2SLGBTQ+ community. Students are also looking to spread positivity during Pride by making colourful posters and by doing a "Chalk the Walk" with positive affirmations and statements (date for that TBA)

- Badminton club: Grade 6, 7 and 8 students each get one recess/nutrition break a week to participate in badminton club. Though this club only started last week, there is good attendance to the club and the students enjoy having more time to play badminton with their friends in their grade.
- The intermediate girls and boys soccer team have been practicing a few mornings each week to prepare for their tournaments at the end of the month. Ms Dawson runs stations at the practices to work on shooting, passing and battling skills. Mme Sierra works with the three goalkeepers on skills like catching, diving and booting.
- Jr. Boys soccer tryouts began in early May 40 boys came out to tryouts. We decided to bring 3 full lines of 7, in order to allow as many students to play as possible. We have been practicing nearly every day, working on passing, dribbling and moving into space. Our tournament was on May 16. All boys played well and represented ECMS in true Thunderbird style. They were supportive of each other and other teams, and kept a positive attitude throughout the tournament. The boys drew their first two games but lost in their last two, finishing 4th place overall.
