

# Emily Carr School Council Meeting Minutes March 28, 2017 @ 18:30

## Approval of January 17, 2017 and February 21, 2017 ECMS Council meeting minutes:

Motion to approve the minutes by Rob Cosh, seconded by Joanne Thompson. Motion carried.

#### Committee Reports:

#### 1. Chair's Report (Mark Sweazey):

- Mr. Bryan White has been in further communication with Bonnenfant regarding the grade 8 Outdoor Education Leadership outing in May. The final date for the outing will be available soon.

- As previously discussed, each student will be asked to contribute \$10 and council will fund the balance of the cost of the Leadership outing.

- Although \$954.86 in funding for the Leadership outing had been approved by an email vote to Council members earlier in March, the total amount required is actually \$1206.20.

Motion to increase the contribution from council to \$1206.20 (from \$954.86) for the Outdoor Education Leadership outing by Rob Cosh, seconded by Joanne Thompson. Motion carried.

## 2. Treasurers Report (Steven Spry):

- Ping pong tables remain in "pending" as we weren't yet able to arrange purchase of any used ping pong tables.

- Mark reported a sale on new ping pong tables at Palason.ca. They have new tables on sale for \$299 (usually \$499) + tax and \$30 delivery – approx. \$368. As a 'classroom set' of 6 tables would be ideal, Mark will check if they will offer a bulk discount for the purchase and delivery of 6 tables.

Motion to increase the allotted ping pong table funding amount to \$1840 for 5 new tables (instead of \$1500 for 6 used tables) by Joanne Thompson, seconded by Juliette Jablasone. Motion carried.

Motion to approve the March Treasurer's Report by Lara MacDonald, seconded by Rob Cosh. Motion carried.

## 3. Principal's Report (G. Thibeault):

- The report outlines the findings of the District Review of best practices which was conducted at ECMS on Mar. 20, 2017, as well as the "next steps" for staff professional development reflecting the district review.

- Core planning for next school year begins in April.

- ETFO – Provincially, teacher's collective agreement has been extended for another 2 years. Now, they are heading into local ratifications.

Motion to approve up to \$750 for the purchase of 30 striped athletic jerseys (at \$33/unit, with the balance of the cost covered by the \$372 left over from gym funding) by Rob Cosh, seconded by Joanne Thompson. Motion carried.

Motion to approve up to \$250 for the grade 5 visit from Glen O and Forest Valley in June (to cover busing costs for Forest Valley students, and refreshments for both schools) by Joanne Thompson, seconded by Rob Cosh, motion carried.

Motion to approve up to \$750 for the grade 8 school leaving ceremony by Lara MacDonald, seconded by Rob Cosh. Motion carried.

Motion to approve the Athletic fees has been tabled until the budget has been recalculated.

## 4. Fund Raising Report (Nora Kennedy):

- Nora was unable to attend the meeting but advised that she is willing to help the grade 8's fundraise for the photo booth for the grade 8 leaving ceremony. Ginette will discuss the organization of the photo booth with Karen Green. Discussion ensued regarding the possibility of the council fundraising (in future years) for Polaroid type photo equipment for the school.
